Many thanks to Tony, David and Roger for their continued effort in keeping the main paths tidy and cut.

We are exploring buying additional soil particularly for our low lying areas, we will keep you posted.

AGM MARCH 2019 SUMMARY



Don Jackson (Chair) opened the meeting welcoming those in attendance to a new venue, the Salvation Army Citadel in Sale. 2018 had been a successful growing year and once again, the annual plant sale was a great success. SHAS continues to have a healthy waiting list with 14 people waiting for plots. As a member of Trafford Allotment Federation, Don reported that management of SHAS compared favourably to other sites in Trafford. On behalf of the Society, Don thanked all the hard working volunteers for their continued contributions which make SHAS successful.

Jane Lucas (Secretary) reported the success of community activities which included allotment visits made by a local children's nursery organised by Peter Jackson, and allotment tours which took place during the annual Ashton 'Picnic in the Park' event. A warm welcome was extended to new committee member Janet Cripps, who has already made valuable contributions to the organisation of the Society.

Tony Turnbull (Membership Secretary) presented a summary of membership activity reporting that at the end of 2018, total membership was 151, which included 101 active plot holders. The lease with Trafford ends next April and will be renegotiated which will include a rent review for the following year. To comply with new Data Protection laws, SHAS had produced a Privacy Policy which is published on the website. It was proposed and agreed to keep the Membership Fee at the same rates in 2020.

Peter Baggaley (Treasurer) presented the annual accounts for the year ending 2018 and thanked Jim Howling for auditing them.

Louise Black (Plots Secretary) reported on plot activity for the year noting that 5 plots had changed ownership. Regular plot inspections in April, June and September ensured that on the whole plots were being well maintained.

Elaine Watson (Trading Hut Manager) reported another successful year for the Trading Hut. Prices remained constant and sales were similar to previous years. Special thanks were extended to Tony, Don and David who had recently renovated the Trading Hut and installed new shelving.

SLUG PELLETS

From June 2019 it will be illegal to sell slug pellets containing Metaldehyde in the UK. If you do want to use slug pellets, you will need to use Ferric phosphate pellets, which are more wildlife friendly. You can buy these at our Trading Hut.
