SHAS ANNUAL PLANT SALE

As usual we will be having our annual plant sale in May. Plant lists and order forms will be available shortly.

SHEDS AND GREENHOUSES

If you want to erect a shed or greenhouse on your plot, you do need to seek approval from the committee first, so please contact Louise to discuss what you want to do. Sheds should be no bigger than 6ft x 4ft and greenhouses no bigger than 6ft x 8ft. Structures are to be kept away from site boundaries to enable the mower to be manoeuvred along paths and its position should not be detrimental to neighbouring plots Any new greenhouse should have polycarbonate glazing. If any glass panes break in an existing greenhouse, these should be replaced with polycarbonate glazing.
