The Society's Welcome Pack has been replaced by our new Allotment Handbook. You will have been emailed a copy and it is available on the website. I would like to commend it to you. It is comprehensive but not long well worth a read. A lot of time and hard work has been put into this by Tony Turnbull, Janet Cripps and Steve Bingham — many thanks are due to them for this.

There is an update elsewhere on the Trading Hut position. We have received an encouraging response to our email for help both from prospective volunteers and managers — if you were thinking of responding but have not got round to it yet it is not too late to get in touch.

We have plans in place for the Trading Hut to reopen with the sale of seed potato and onion sets. We are confident that we will soon have longer term plans to share with you. It is a facility that we all value and intend to retain. We have renewed our membership of the National Allotment Society (NAS). We pay a fee based on the number of plot holders (not members). This has prompted us to look at the benefits we are getting for both you the plot holder and us as a society generally. The members section of the NAS website (www.nsalg.org.uk) is worth a browse. You will need our login and password — please email me for the information (chairman@shas.org.uk). There are a few benefits that you may find worthwhile, namely: (i) plot holder insurance, (ii) the 40% discount from Kings Seeds when ordered via the NAS scheme. The catalogue is on their website and we can give you the details and instructions on how to place an order, and (iii) there is a quarterly magazine which is again on the NAS website digitally, or you can subscribe to a hard copy for £10.00. Nearer to home, did you know that if you're a member of Trafford Library you can access electronic magazines without cost via your membership? You may find it worth a look, there are a respectable number of gardening/ growing magazines available.

In closing can I mention the 2022 AGM. This would normally be held in early March but given the levels of Covid that are still around we are minded to leave the AGM until the levels of infection are down to comfortable levels before we all meet up. Hopefully we will not have to wait too long and perhaps next year we can get back on track in March.
