Chairman's Report

In this area of the North West we've had a mild winter so far compared to other parts, this could be good or bad we'll have to wait and see how our crops perform this year.

Activity on our allotments has hardly stopped this winter, manure has been delivered to our two storage bays and to the top path. Most has been consumed by our plot holders and either spread over their plots or dug in. Most allotments are now being cultivated, Sylvia has been busy introducing new members and letting plots which have been neglected or given up, even so our waiting list continues to grow. Ken has also been busy sending out membership renewal notices.

We now have an allotment tenant who is a nurse and she has asked us to remind you that anyone who touches soil etc should have a valid tetanus inoculation!!

Most of our allotment compost bins have now been taken. SHAS is therefore doing it's bit to recycle waste. We have learnt that the contents from your home Green wheelie bins is processed at Trafford's Sharston plant then goes to local farms for their use ,we are checking whether this can be purchased by Trafford rate payers, we will keep you informed. We, your committee, are also considering making reclaimed compost available at the Trading hut from another source near the New Smithfield Market M11 details will be provided later.

In December our Glebelands Road gates were rammed damaging the gates and Lionel's plot number 48. This damage has been reported to the Trafford Police Allotment Watch section, no one has yet been traced for the damage. We have placed details of the Trafford Allotment Watch on each of the SHAS notice boards should a plot holder experience any vandalism.

Sylvia has started our 2006 social activity list which includes our AGM in March, Trading Hut openings (we still need trading hut helpers) our Plant sale, Talk dates and a new innovation, coffee morning in the amenity building.
