Despite global warming or alternatively, having normal regular cyclic weather changes, as a large number of people prefer to believe, SHAS had a good and productive year. The moderate weather has helped our gardens and allotments, most crops have flourished, our lawn mowers have been very active even into November.

Many people are trying to become fitter by eating healthier food. The demand for allotments continues to outstrip availability. There are now over 100,000 people on the UK allotment waiting lists and 10,000 in the NW.

Our special "Pathways" plot is a credit to the supervisors and their helpers by growing flowers and a wide variety of vegetables and fruits. They now plan to expand a little further developing more of the hitherto poor unusable land with raised beds and a suitable greenhouse. It is also planned that the activity on this plot can assist the recovery or lifestyle of stroke victims.

Our Halloween party was a great success being attended by around 90 members and friends including many children. The weather could not have been better. Our many games/races /fancy dress and competitions were very well supported. The sun flower challenge and pumpkin carving display was excellent. SECURITY!

The middle gate is being wrongly secured by only wrapping the chain round. It is very simple to cut a chain with bolt cutters as recently happened,
