From our Equipment Manager:-

Path Maintenance

David requests that you keep your paths clear of debris, weeds and stones. These damage the machines causing extra work and costs.

Well-kept paths set off your plot creating an initial impression of care or lack of it, and need to be regularly cut and edged, by hand if necessary.

Overhanging branches from fruit trees are also a hazard so please keep an eye on them but not literally.

Talking of fruit trees, the committee is a little concerned about the number and size of those on site. They should be on a dwarfing rootstock. Please prune your trees to a height that they can be easily harvested. They should not cast shade on your or your neighbours' plots to a degree that limits what other crops can be grown.



We also remind you that new sheds are limited to size 6'x4' and permission to erect a new one sought from the committee. Existing sheds should be well-maintained or removed.

We have been working in partnership with the Stroke Association and the Probation Team working towards making the Pathways plot accessible for service users who wheelchairs. We hope to develop future community projects together and will keep you up to date with our plans.

Some of our plans at present include a wildlife project and we are leaving a small area of our allotment in its natural state to preserve and encourage wildlife.

Ideas at the moment are hedgehog and insect boxes and also bird boxes, a small area of wild flowers and bee and butterfly attracting plants and
