CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Happy New Year to all our members!

Well 2014 was quite a good year in our gardens and on our allotments due to better than average weather at the appropriate times, my plum crop was disappointing but other plots had good yields, vegetables and apple crops were excellent with the blackbirds appreciating the windfalls!

Our plant sale was again a success despite the lower number of orders, many thanks to Jonathan for organising this event and to his helpers.

The Pathways community plot, which is maintained by gardeners with differing learning needs and the members of After Stroke Association, has had a chequered year with funding being withdrawn, but fortunately the stroke unit has now received new financing which is enabling them to continue.

Our Trading Hut has been well patronised including the extra 1st Saturday of the month opening, again many thanks to Elaine and her team of helpers.

We were awarded the Most Improved Allotment Site by Trafford, thanks to the efforts of the majority of plot-holders and to Roger for keeping our many paths cut and tidy.

Our allotment site, together with four others in and around Greater Manchester has been considered for a new venture in future ITV Coronation Street programmes. After several meetings SHAS Site has been chosen as meeting the production criteria of best location and surroundings and being the most photogenic. First filming will start on 23 January and 9 February and will continue at various dates for six months. Filming may extend further depending on viewer response statistics. Filming will take place at the Glebelands Road end, which is

most suitable for recording, siting of all the equipment, generators, lights, toilets and catering arrangements. Filming will start at 8am possibly through to noon, come 'rain or shine'.

Due to the location and in order not to interrupt continuity during filming, will plot-holders who usually use the Glebelands Road entrance gate, please use the middle gate entrance on Grosvenor Road, when filming is taking place. Actual filming dates will be entered when known on the 'Events Page' of our website, to assist affected plot-holders and for interested members.

ITV will have a Security Guard stationed at the Glebelands Road entrance gate to avoid interference while filming. For anybody interested in watching while filming it should be possible outside, over the fence near our manure/leaf mould bays.

ITV will be paying SHAS a fee for the use of the site and will return our allotments to a good workable state after they have finished filming. ITV have reassured me that they will try to limit disturbance to our plot-holders and want to know if any problems arise.

This new Coronation Street storyline involving allotments is a first and hopefully will promote allotment life and our Trafford Area.

As they say 'Watch this space' and our 'Events Page' on our website entries. No doubt our local papers will also include articles about the filming activities.

In closing, can I wish all our members a healthy and enjoyable 2015, not forgetting thanks to your committee and our many helpers.
