An order form is attached to this newsletter. Halman's Nursery delivers these bedding plants to the Trading Hut gates early on the morning of Saturday May 12<sup>th</sup>. They are plants of good quality and at competitive prices. We make up your orders in advance and you collect them between 1pm and 3pm that afternoon.

#### The deadline for handing in your order form and payment is Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> May and this cannot be exceeded!

If you will be away, please make your own arrangements for the plants to be collected and looked after until you return.

#### Tomatoes

These come from a separate supplier and the variety cannot be guaranteed at the time of ordering. However a suitable substitute of the same type is always sent.

#### Surplus plants

There is inevitably a small surplus of some plants which will be sold on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> May. Call in at the Hoe Down and see what's on offer.



#### AGM NEWS

This was the first AGM to be held in The Hoe Down. In reviewing the year's activities, Don Jackson, the chairman, said we continued to try to improve the workings of SHAS. He regretted the absence of a summer newsletter. The purchase of a colour printer would make us self reliant in the printing of the newsletter in future when necessary.

Other expenses incurred in trying to improve the allotment site were largely due to using the services of a contractor for grass cutting. The committee decided to purchase a good mower and strimmer and to undertake the cutting of the main paths themselves to reduce this considerable cost.

He thanked Keith Jones for his long service in the trading hut and announced that Alf Edwards had agreed to take on the organisation of Trading for the society.

The awards and buffet evening held for members in October was again subsidised by the society. Talks had been held during the year, but our social side is still lacking and we would try to address that aspect for members in the coming year.

He was pleased that the raised beds were being used very successfully.

He welcomed Tony Turnbull to the committee and thanked members for their work over the year which had resulted in us gaining an award for the most improved site in Trafford The **Membership** secretary, Ken Bostock, reported a drop in membership in 2006 which had been 164, 10 fewer than 2005. He encouraged members to recruit others to take advantage of the competitive prices for supplies in the Trading Hut.

The **Allotment** secretary, Linda McLachlan, reported that 13 plots had changed hands during the year. The high demand for plots had given us a waiting list of 30 in September, at which point the committee decided to close the list. It will be re-opened when it gets below 20.

The team clearing the wild areas had achieved a great deal and it was hoped that further land would be available soon for letting.

Carpets are not to be used on plots and also any complaints should be given to a committee member in writing rather than verbally to avoid misunderstanding.

The **Treasurer**, Jonathan Richards said that the considerable outlay on paying a contractor to cut the main paths could not be sustained and a rota of committee members would undertake the task using the machinery bought this year at a cost of £500. The use of this machinery is to be limited to the committee to try to avoid the expense of repairs. Plot-holders are responsible for their own side paths but can have these cut by Kevin Brooks at a charge of £2. audited The accounts were accepted by the meeting.

#### Elections

The serving officers and members of the committee were all willing to be re-elected. Mr Alf Edwards was confirmed as Trading Hut manager. Mr Tony Turnbull was confirmed as a committee member.

#### **Fresh Horse manure**

The stables on Little Ees Lane off Glebelands Road, has readv bagged horse manure free to collect. If you need a key to the gate please contact Sylvia. If Kay is there, introduce yourself from SHAS and help yourself. The manure, being fresh must be stacked or composted until the autumn. If put on fresh the ammonia will burn your plants. It will be a power of good in your compost heap, however, heating it up and killing off weed seeds.

You might also build a hot-bed by digging a pit and filling it with the

manure. Cover it with a deep layer of soil. Here you can grow on your seedlings and later melons, and cucumbers, especially with a frame over it.

#### Allotments

Last year Trafford awarded the Grosvenor Road site the prize for 'Most improved allotment site' in the Borough. This was very encouraging and we are looking at ways to improve even more.

Plot holders can really help by keeping the small grass paths between plots **cut and edged**. (This is not an optional extra but forms part of your tenancy agreement with the Society) If, however, you feel unable to do this please see Kevin Brooks (plot 38) who has offered to trim people's paths for £2.

The other way you can help is by getting rid of the things on your plot which 'may come in handy'. **They rarely do.** If they have been there for years the odds are you are never going to use them. So have a plot spring-clean, a trip to the tip and squeeze an extra crop or some flowers on the land you have regained!

There has been a prolonged effort to clear two of the very overgrown areas and put them back in to cultivation. They will soon be ready for re-let and help decrease our still very long waiting list.

The first plot inspection of the year is scheduled for the beginning of April. So sharpen the spade, pick up the pruners, lift the hoe and give your gardening muscles a workout. You know you enjoy it really!

### **Trading Hut**

The **Trading Hut** is open every Sunday morning during March, April, May and June.

We have been busy already and have sold out of onion sets and some varieties of seed potato. We have just a few kilos of potatoes and packs of shallots left (and then ....that's shallot!).

Now is the time to feed the soil: -

**Potash** is essential for all crops. It enables plants to withstand disease and adverse weather. It also accentuates flavour and colour. Potash is released by Potassium Nitrate, Sulphate of Potash, poultry manure and bone meal.

**Nitrogen** is necessary to start and sustain plant growth.Nitrates are released by Sulphate of Ammonia, fish meal and dried blood.

**Phosphates** are important for root development and bringing plants to maturity. Phosphates are present in bone meal and superphosphates.

All the above fertilizers are on sale in the trading hut at really low prices. Alf Edwards – Trading Hut Manager
