

### NEW CHAIRMAN AND SHAS UPDATE

As mentioned in the last edition of Grass Cuttings, although Committee meetings are not actually being held in person, we have been working together via email/telephone to discuss the AGM and election of a new Chairman. The Committee is therefore very pleased to report the following actions which have been agreed:

- 1 That the AGM be postponed until September or October 2021
- 2 That Chris Abbott be appointed as Acting Chairman with immediate effect, to continue until the next AGM, when a Chairman will be formally elected by the membership
- 3 That Phil Gorman be appointed as Acting Vice-Chairman with immediate effect, to work with Chris Abbott until the next AGM. Prior to the AGM the Committee to decide whether to propose the continuation of this role.

It has also been agreed that at the next AGM, the Committee will propose that Don Jackson is made a Life Member of SHAS in acknowledgement of his work over many years as Chairman. The Committee is planning to hold a meeting in person after 17 May when further restrictions around social gatherings are relaxed. We've a number of things to discuss and it will provide the opportunity for our new Chairman Chris to start getting to grips with the role.

The sale of our seed potatoes and red and white onions went exceptionally well this year — everything sold out on the first day we opened. Never happened before! Thanks to all members who came down and bought potatoes and onions, and many apologies to those who couldn't get what they wanted. It really is difficult to gauge what demand will be. We used the Trading Hut and the Hoedown to serve members and I hope everyone will agree that these arrangements worked very well, there was less queuing so it's quite possible we'll consider doing the same again next year. Unfortunately I did have a disaster with the shallots and had none to sell this year — they were all rotten, which the supplier blamed on bad weather.

The Trading Hut remains open every Sunday in the month, apart from the first weekend of each month when it opens on a Saturday — dates are published on the gates.

Orders should be made by email with pre-payment by bank transfer. However, if any member finds ordering and paying on-line difficult, I am happy to deal with normal cash sales. Some members are ordering by email but paying in cash on the day and this seems to be working well. Hopefully by June/July, the Trading Hut will get back to normal, but obviously we'll let you all know when the time is right.

I do want to thank members who have been buying from the Trading Hut for their patience and understanding. Our supplier is doing his best to get products to us despite a number of problems i.e. poor potato crops, flooding, canes stuck in the Suez Canal, firms with no plastic bags or tubs to put products in, no Coir available, the list goes on... So at times I do not know what will be arriving but at present most things are available.
