Chairman's Report

Hi All

My calendar indicates spring has arrived; well it takes some believing of late! However certain trees are showing tinges of green and several bird species have started to collect for their nests. I hope the doom & gloom from the media people is wrong again.

I am pleased to report Trafford MBC has continued their investigations into our allotment drainage problems, water is now flowing all be it slowly. The engineers have now discovered a blockage, probably roots, in the main, nine-inch diameter drainpipe beneath a large Spruce tree on our boundary. TMBC plan to remove the blockage or lay a new pipe to bye pass the blockage. The Environment Agency (AE) also hopes to clear the open ditches in the fields beyond Glebelands Road to improve the water flow.

Reminding our members by e-mail of our Trading Hut opening times and what products are available has been a great success. Our range of seed potatoes have completely sold out, while we still have a few bags of shallots and onion sets available. Other products for sale include a range of fertilisers, particularly lawn care items, which will be needed when the lawns start to grow as the weather becomes warmer! Once again we will be holding our annual bedding plant sale, spare plant list and order forms are available in the Trading hut on Sunday mornings.

Most gardeners and plot holders have started to tidy up in preparation for planting so let us look forward to the rewards for our efforts.

a life member of the society. This was unanimously carried.

He welcomed Elaine Watson to the committee.

The **Secretary** thanked Don Jackson for gaining Councillor Rigby's support in his negotiations with both Trafford BC and the Environment Agency over the extensive flooding.

There had been one talk during the year but the Pumpkin party did not have sufficient support this year.

The **Membership Secretary** thanked all who had paid their plot rentals early.

Plot rents had been increased by 5% in 2012 and were due to rise by another 5% in 2013. This had been passed on to plot-holders, making the rental 21p per square metre. We are now at the end of our five year price agreement with Trafford and we await notification of their future rental proposals which could be a significant increase.

The **Allotment Secretary** reported 9 plots had changed hands since the last AGM and the waiting list now stood at 24 with three plots unlettable due to flooding. Sadly, three plot-holders, Graham Hamner, Nigel Biss and Helen Blackburn had died during the year.

The **Treasurer** presented the annual accounts for the year ended 31st December 2012.

A new Auditor will need to be appointed.

Election of Committee

Elaine Watson was appointed as Trading Manager in place of Alf Edwards.

Don Jackson thanked members for their presence and declared the meeting closed at 8.30pm
