WHEELBARROWS

We have invested in a number of new wheelbarrows for use by plot holders. All are clearly identifiable and are marked with 'SHAS' in paint on the sides.

They will now be stored in the white storage building located almost centrally on the allotment site.

The wheelbarrows must be returned to the storage building after use so that other plot holders can make use of them.

This storage building can also be used by plot holders to keep other items dry and safe. There is a light switch located just inside the door on the right.

SITE SAFETY

Please be mindful of potential hazards around the site and not let young children run about unsupervised; other plot holders might be using strimmers and lawn mowers and have tools lying around their plots as they work — we do not want any accidents.

You may want to consider whether you leave expensive tools in sheds and greenhouses, we have had incidents in the past when items have been stolen. If it's not practical to take such items home, the white storage building near the middle gate can be used to store them.

When entering and leaving the site please make sure the gates are securely locked.

MANURE

We have a plentiful supply of horse manure delivered to the bay at the side of the Trading Hut throughout the year. This is free for everybody. It's generally best to use well-rotted manure so why not pile up some bags on your plot, or empty them into a compost bin and in a few months' time you'll have a really useful source of manure for your veggies.
