Chairman's Report

I hope you all had a very happy Christmas.

Looking back on 2008, congratulations to several of our plot holders who won recognition for their efforts from Trafford and SHAS.

Our newly planted external hedge is now beginning to grow and will eventually improve our security and assist our ecology efforts.

The new Trafford Pathways Project plot to help individuals with learning difficulties is now almost complete with its raised beds and paths. This area was both cleared and constructed by the probation service.

Our recent social happening, the BBQ and Pumpkin party was a great success being attended by members, their children and friends. A good time was had by all. Many photos can be seen on our web site. The talk by Hugh Beggs was interesting, though more people could have attended.

The Federation of Trafford Allotments has just been formed. Louise Black and I are on this committee. It is the Federation's intention to have representatives from the majority of the 33 allotment sites in the Trafford Borough. One of the main aims of the Federation is to try and obtain grants from the 'Local Food Lottery' organisation. We at SHAS have several project needs to improve the facilities on our Grosvenor Rd Site. Several plots were severely flooded during the summer, each of which require improved drainage and many tons of extra top soil. We are looking to improve the main pathways to assist vehicular traffic and walking by installing a system of special turf reinforcement mesh, but still retaining the grass.


Considering the environment, we have another project under review to harvest rainwater from our buildings, store and connect this water system to our existing irrigation system.

It will not be easy to obtain these grants but we should not ignore this current opportunity to improve our facilities, save money, plus better our allotment growing conditions. We will keep you updated with our efforts with the 'Local Food Lottery'.

As always I must on your behalf thank your hard working committee and our helpers for their work throughout 2008, and thank you for your support to the SHAS activities.

Plot Helpers Scheme

Do you have a plot and fancy a bit of help?

Are you on the Waiting List and keen to get a taste of allotment life?

Then we may have an idea that will appeal to you.

We are hoping to set up a scheme whereby people on the waiting list will be able to help existing plot holders cultivate their plots.

We anticipate this could be of mutual benefit.

Purely voluntary, the scheme will be run on the following lines:

- 1. The plot holder would be expected to share some of the produce with their helper. There will be no payments involved.
- 2. Volunteers will retain their place on the waiting list but will not have any right to take over the plot if the present plot holder relinquishes it.
- 4. All volunteers will be Society members and therefore subject to the same rules as existing plot holders.
- 5. Helpers or plot holders will be able to discontinue the arrangement at any time if either wants to, by simply telling me no reason required!
- 6. Volunteers will be loaned an allotment gate key, which must be returned if they stop helping. (returnable deposit will be payable)
