It is great to know that we have such an invested cohort of members who are keen to support the future progression of the site. As you know we only had space for two people to be co-opted so I'd like to welcome Tina Cooper and Bernadette Miller as our newly co-opted Committee members. The hedge trim which was completed as part of the newly signed lease has been a huge success, and I hope you'll agree it has vastly improved not only the aesthetics of the perimeter but also pavement accessibility. We have also had the tree line canopy toward the back of the site lifted and some of the trees reduced — this will hopefully mean that we can avoid

these trees from becoming an issue that effects the nearby plots and reduces the risk of these plots becoming unusable. There are still some overgrown tree branches on the pavement side which we are in discussion with the council about.

Finally, I'd like to extend my thanks to the Committee for all their hard work over the last few months and a huge thankyou to the newly formed working party set up by Rosemary Budd. Rosemary has done a fantastic job in pulling this together in addition to her already busy role and I know that it has been an incredible help around site.

# SKIP FOR DISPOSAL OF NON-GREEN WASTE FROM SITE

We have had multiple requests for support in removing rubbish from site and are therefore planning to hire a skip in November for the disposal of non-green waste items currently on the site. If you have something you would like to put in this skip please email allotments@shas.org.uk with brief details of the item(s) prior to 3 November. Not only will this help us judge the size of the skip required, but it will allow us to collate these items and give other plot holders the opportunity to reuse anything destined for the skip — one man's waste is another man's gold!

The skip is not for any form of vegetation/soil and we would ask that you do not bring items to site from home for disposal. We would also remind plot holders that whilst we recognise that on occasions there are circumstances which make the removal of waste challenging, all plot holders agree as part of our Handbook that removal of waste from site is the plot holder's responsibility.

Please compost green waste as much as possible on your plot.

#### BURNING RUBBISH

Fires are allowed from 1 October to 31 March

The Council do receive complaints from neighbours of allotment sites so can we remind everybody that in the best interests of plot holders and neighbours you adhere to the rules which are laid out in our Handbook and if you decide it is really necessary to have a bonfire:

- Only burn dry material, to avoid creating excessive amounts of smoke
- Do not light bonfires if the wind will blow smoke over the surrounding houses
- Keep the duration of the bonfire to a minimum
- Bonfires must be attended at all times while lit
- Ensure that bonfires are completely dead before being left unattended
